

# Common European Framework of reference for languages (CEFR) A1

- You can understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type.
- You can introduce him/herself and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has.
- You can interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.

### <u>Self Led Learning Recommendations</u>

We recommend you spend 5-10 minutes of self-led study, which involves:

- Homework,
- Reading over the material looked at in class
- Applying concepts seen in class to reallife situations. (e.g. to introduce oneself, to spell out names and to be able to give your phone number).
